

Re: Uniform New York State Email Retention and FOIL Policy

Dear Majority Leader Skelos, Speaker Heastie, Democratic Conference Leader Stewart-Cousins, Independent Democratic Conference Leader Klein, Minority Leader Kolb, Attorney General Schneiderman and Comptroller DiNapoli,

As you know, the subject of email retention and FOIL has come to the forefront in recent weeks. Last week, Governor Cuomo announced that we would bring together representatives from the legislature, the Attorney General and the Comptroller's office to formulate one uniform policy for email retention and FOIL that will apply to all state officials and agencies. While this has

been a contentious issue publicly, our administration sees the debate as an opportunity to dramatically increase transparency for all branches of state government.

To that end, we will convene the first meeting on this subject in the next two weeks. As a threshold matter, the Legislature currently has not adopted FOIL. As you know, this FOIL statute dates back to 1974 in New York, and is a rudimentary starting point. If emails or documents are not available to the public, the question of retention is moot.

Please let me know who your representative will be for this meeting. We can then engage further with your representative on arranging the meeting.
